Please note that all in-kind donations which are not conducive to use in the barn will be sold so the money can help the children.

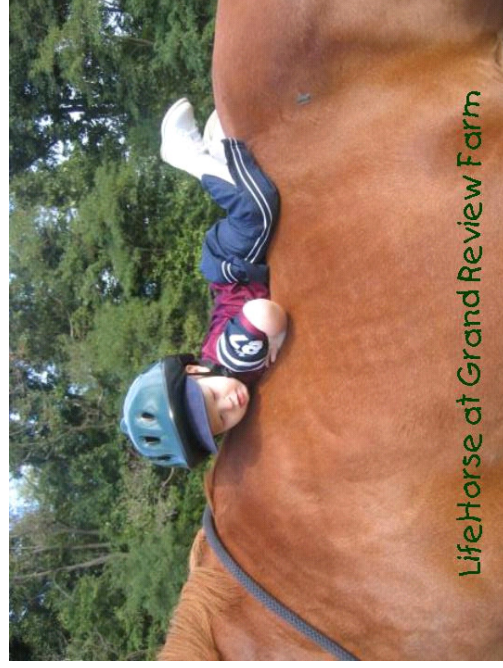

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About LifeHorse

LifeHorse at Grand Review Farm was founded in April, 2002. The program is new and exciting and brings hope to Children who might not otherwise have much. LifeHorse is a riding



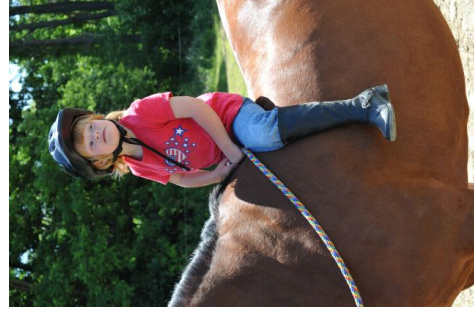
program for Terminally and chronically ill children to ride and be around

horses. Children aged 3-21 are accepted into the program and are allowed to participate to their full ability. While some of the children are too sick to actually ride a horse, they find hope and joy in brushing or feeding or even just sitting on a bale of hay and talking to a horse. Those children who are strong enough to ride are allowed to progress at their own speed and level. This may mean a child on a horse with someone leading him and a side walker on each side, or it may mean a child having a private lesson on a horse who they are riding all by themselves. Some of the children choose not to ride at all, they prefer to ride in a carriage and learn to drive the horses. The program is of no charge to the children and their families.

Who Qualifies?

Children with the following conditions qualify for LifeHorse:

- ALS
- Arthritis
- Autism
- Asperger's Syndrome
- Cancer
- Chronic Asthma
- Cystic Fibrosis
- Diabetes
- Epilepsy
- Genetic Disorders (EG: Down syndrome, Fragile X, PKU)
- Heart Disease
- Hemophilia
- HIV/AIDS/Immunodeficiency
- Kidney Disease
- Liver Disease
- Selective or Social Mutism
- Sickle Cell Anemia
- Spina Bifida



FAQ

1. Are you a camp?

No, we are not a camp. LifeHorse is a year-round horseback riding program that teaches kids to ride and even show. Kids come one-on-one and progress at their own speed. Most kids come once a week, with their parent(s). Instead of being lost in a group, children receive individual support and attention from volunteers who share in their private tears and personal victories.

2. How are you different from a handicapped riding program?

Our students are facing terminal and chronic illnesses, or genetic disorders, most of them are 100% able bodied; however, some of the students face physical disabilities as a result of their illnesses. Unlike MOST handicapped riding facilities, our students come to the farm one at a time, not in a large group.

3. How much does it cost the families?

Our program is 100% free of charge to the families.

4. How is the program funded?

Our program is funded through grants and sponsorships.

5. What are your hours?

LifeHorse does not have regular hours. Since our students are facing many different illnesses, it is hard to plan when they will feel like riding. Instead, most parents call and tell us when their child is having a good day and we do our very best to accommodate them.
